Winemaker Notes

Despite its warm, western facing location, our Out of Sight vineyard in the southeastern region of Napa Valley is one of the last vineyards we harvest. This luxury of extra hang time on the vine along with its revered location makes Out of Sight one of our most desired vineyards. In a vintage that demanded special vigilance in the vineyard and cellar, our 2011 Out of Sight exhibits dense, dark blueberry and blackberry aromas with a hint of savory herbs. In the mouth, blueberry and currant flavors take center stage, with notes of vanilla, oak and peat moss in supporting roles. This is what we call a “big, big” Cab – dense, muscular and built for the long haul.

On the Vine

Heading south on the Silverado Trail, the road traces the hilly contours of eastern Napa Valley. Around corners and over low stone walls, the drive offers glimpses of some the most desired vineyards in the world. Just south of the Stags Leap District lies one of Flora Springs’ most cherished properties—Kairos Vineyard—and if you can imagine, the views from here are “Out of Sight.”

In 1999, when the family purchased this vineyard, the wild appearance of the old head-pruned vines more than suggested their years of neglect. It took nearly three years for Pat Garvey and his vineyard team to transform the tired vineyard into one which now produces some of our finest Cabernet. The vines were trained into a contemporary Vertical Trellis system and cover crops were planted to promote the proper organic matter in the soil. Today, this organically-farmed vineyard continues to amaze with its expression of fruit and complexity from vines that have been given a new lease on life.
